

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT
Reporting to Public Session Tuesday, June 10, 2014

1. Odyssey of the Mind

Celebrating 30 years in British Columbia, Odyssey of the Mind promotes creative problem solving for students from Kindergarten through College.

On Saturday, April 26, 2014 three teams from South Slope Elementary School / BCSD competed in the Odyssey of the Mind Provincial Tournament at Burnaby North Secondary School.

There were two parts to the competition:

1) Teams were given a spontaneous verbal or hands-on challenge where they had to think and respond quickly and demonstrate teamwork.

2) Teams presented their creative solution to a long term problem.

Two of the three teams that participated in the Provincials won gold and the third team won silver. All three teams had the opportunity to attend the World Finals in Ames, Iowa in May.

This evening, Principal South Slope Elementary School, Janice Nakatsu, will provide an overview of the Iowa events. Students Connor Strandberg, Jordan Hui, Catie Alvarez, Kaitlyn Schenkeveld and Antonina Stoicheva will share their thoughts and experiences.

2. BCSD's Amazing Race

The 2nd annual Amazing Race is part of a 3 day event hosted by the Provincial Outreach Program for Deaf and Hearing for students from all over BC. This year's event included 42 Deaf and Hard of Hearing students from Dawson Creek, Kelowna, Salmon Arm, Vernon, Trail, Nelson, Nakusp, Langley, New Westminster, Burnaby and BCSD.

In keeping with the Ministry of Education's mandated focus on the trades, the theme of this year's event was Careers. Race teams navigated their way around downtown Vancouver in search of businesses, employers, and employees where various job-related tasks awaited them. The importance of Deaf and Hard of Hearing students socializing with like peers cannot be underestimated. Students look forward to these events each

3. City of Burnaby Environment Awards

4. 2014-2015 Student Fees

In accordance with the School Act, the Board of Education is required to approve a schedule of student fees for the 2014-2015 school year. Current legislation requires that any material that is essential to the delivery of any school course that leads to graduation or school leaving must be offered free of charge with the following exceptions:

- x Purchase of paper, writing tools, calculators (excluding graphing calculators) and other school supplies and equipment for a student's personal use
- x School activity fees: agenda books, student activity dues, special events and graduation activities
- x Purchase or rental of musical instruments for a student's personal use
- x Purchase or rental of tools, materials or equipment for a student's personal use in trades training or apprenticeship programs
- x Schools may also charge fees for extra-curricular or enrichment activities on a cost recovery basis. This includes, but is not limited to, enrichment field trips where the activity is not assessed as part of the student's required graduation program, inter-school athletics, intramural activities, dances, clubs, ski trips and travel abroad.
- x Schools may charge for the cost of certification when the certification is not part of the requirements of the course
- x Boards of Education may also offer specialty academies with the approval of the
