## **Superintendent's Report**

Gina Niccoli-Moen, Superintendent of Schools, reported that the district has had a magnificent start to the new school year with the receipt of two awards - one for its International Student Program and one for its Language Instruction for New-comers to Canada (LINC) Program.

### Study Travel Magazine STAR High School Program Award

Study Travel (ST) Magazine is a leading voice within the international education sector. Its ST Award is a unique, peer-voted award in the study travel industry where agents vote for their preferred educational organizations.

Angela Ferraro, Managing Director, International Education, who accepted the award on behalf of the International Student Program. The program started in the 2002/2003 school year with 92 students. Since then it has welcomed around 7,000 students and in the 2016/2017 school year expects to enroll 1,500 students from 37 countries. The program's focus on developing cultural understanding garnered the district this award. The district has a regional team approach that is being copied by other districts; it also has an international student support worker in each of its secondary schools a resource that is not available in other districts.

### LINC Program and Provincial Award

Louise Thorburn, Manager Community and Continuing Education, noted that the district's LINC program helps newcomers to develop not only their language skills but to become active members of their community. There are now 17 teachers who are active in the program.

Teachers Augusta Avram and Maria Kenward described how technology is used to assist students through the use of computers and other media such as twitter. Literacy is also taken beyond the classroom and students have participated in various activities that included building eco-sculptures, a field trip to Burnaby Lake and assisting with pop-up libraries. They have assisted with bottle recycling and garage sales which improves their numeracy and language skills. They are also encouraged to participate i
